

City of Milano City Council Meeting Minutes
Monday, June 15, 2020 – 6:30 pm
Milano Civic Center 120 West Avenue E Milano, TX 76556

Mayor Westbrook called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Mayor established there was a quorum present. All council members were present. The meeting opened with greetings from Mayor Westbrook. Mayor Westbrook gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

During public comment time: Kim Lenz spoke to the council about the need for traffic signs along the city streets. Mrs. Lenz suggested the need for speed signs, slow children playing, children at play, etc. What signs that do exist are faded and old. Many have fallen. Also, Mrs. Lenz suggested the need for the county to patrol the streets to try to slow speeding vehicles down.

Councilman Edward Lenz made the motion to approve the city council meeting minutes of March 16, 2020 and approve the financial report dated March 17, 2020 through June 15, 2020. There were no city council meetings in April or May, 2020 due to COVID-19. Councilman Glenda Westbrook seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Steve Honeycutt made the motion to issue requests for proposals (RFPs) for administrative services and requests for qualifications (RFQs) for engineering services related to the Community Development Block Grant – Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) grant programs administered by the Texas General Land Office (GLO). Councilman Edward Lenz seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.


Councilman Edward Lenz made the motion to make the last lease-to-own payment to Barney Knight for the property at 225 S 5th Street. The current balance due is \$5,577.50. Councilman John Paniagua seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman John Paniagua made the motion to pay the balance due to Knight and Associates for legal services. The current balance due is \$6,284.41. Councilman Bryan Woods seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.


Councilman Edward Lenz made the motion to cancel the July 4th parade and community wide hot dog lunch due to COVID-19 restrictions that are in place at this time. Councilman John Paniagua seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
